Our November 21 speaker is Frank A. O'Reilly, historian with Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park.

Topic: "Fredericksburg: From Stonewall to Stone Wall"

The Battle of Fredericksburg was a barometer for the world to gauge the progress of the Civil War at the end of 1862. It was easily simplified into absolutes in people's minds: it was the easiest victory Robert E. Lee ever had—Ambrose Burnside was a well-meaning incompetent—and the terrible Stone Wall was impregnable against all odds. But the campaign and battle at Fredericksburg were far more complicated and intriguing than that! Frank O'Reilly will discuss all the subtleties and surprises that challenge historians and students even today.

Frank A. O'Reilly is a distinguished Civil War historian. His book, *The Fredericksburg Campaign: Winter War on the Rappahannock*, received a 2003 nomination for the Pulitzer Prize in Letters. It won the 2002 Capital District (Albany, NY) Book Award, the 2003 James I. Robertson, Jr. Book Award, the 2004 Daniel Laney Book Award, and the 2004 Richard Barksdale Harwell Book Award.

Frank received his BA and MA in American History, with a concentration in Early American Military History and Civil War Studies, from Washington & Lee University before joining the National Park Service as a historian. His first book, *Stonewall Jackson at Fredericksburg*, was published in 1993. He has written numerous articles on the Civil War and Mexican War for national and international journals, appeared in several documentaries, and lectured extensively on military history to audiences around the world, including several conferences in the United Kingdom at Oxford. He is currently researching a book on the Battle of Malvern Hill and the Seven Days' Campaign around Richmond.




Ramblings from the Raffle Table
