


Speaker: Sarah Kay Bierle

Presentation Overview: The New Market Campaign How did the armies get to New Market for the battle on May 15, 1864? What were the objectives of the campaign? How did the campaign and battle fit into the overall strategic plans for the war in Virginia? This presentation delves deeper in the New Market Campaign and reexamines its challenges and outcomes beyond the famous battle.

Speakers Bio: Sarah Kay Bierle graduated from Thomas Edison State University with a BA in History, serves as managing editor at Emerging Civil War, and works in the Education Department at American Battlefield Trust. She has spent years exploring ways to share quality historical research in ways that will inform and inspire modern audiences, including school presentations, writing, and speaking engagements. Sarah has published three historical fiction books and her first nonfiction book, *Call Out The Cadets: The Battle of New Market*, is part of the Emerging Civil War series.

For the April presentation of the Frederick County Civil War Roundtable, Randy Drais presented one of the more unusual facets of the Gettysburg National battlefield. A lifelong amateur historian, Randy led over 20 viewers both in person and on-line through a fascinating presentation centered on the existence of many rock carvings. These carvings made by soldiers during the battle or by veterans upon their return or by civilians or tourists, rock carvings can be found on many areas of the 6,000 or so acres that encompass the Gettysburg National Military Park.

Looking for rock carvings is an extremely interesting and unusual way to explore the battlefield, but it is also an extremely interesting and unusual way to discover some of the battlefield history that is often overlooked or quickly forgotten, especially of the personal and often tragic stories of soldiers, both Union and Confederate, who left their mark, both figuratively and literally, on this hallowed ground. Join Randy Drais, amateur Civil War historian



and Battle of Gettysburg buff, for a look at many of the rock carvings on the Gettysburg battlefield and the stories behind them.






Selection 1: Jackson's Valley Campaign, Hardback, 1988

Ever Forward! History of the 116th Infantry (Virginia National Guard) (Stonewall Brigade), Paperback, 2008





- **full-day battlefield tours** exploring the 1864 Battle of New Market, Sharpsburg and Shepherdstown civilians during the 1862 Maryland Campaign...
