Speaker: Bradley Gottfried

Topic: *Lee Invades the North: A Comparison of the Maryland and Gettysburg Campaigns*

Brad Gottfried returns to our FCCWRT! He was born and raised in Philadelphia. After receiving his Ph.D. (Zoology) in 1976, he embarked on a 40-year career in higher education. He was a full-time faculty member for eleven years at three colleges, and then entered the ranks of the administration, rising to the role of President. He served in this capacity for seventeen years at two colleges, retiring as the President of the College of Southern Maryland in 2017. He now devotes his time to writing and giving tours of the Antietam battlefield (he is a certified Antietam battlefield guide) and the town of Gettysburg (he is a licensed town guide).

Brad's strong interest in the Civil War has led to the publication of 19 books, with several more in the pipeline. Many have been map studies of the Eastern Theater Campaign. His books have won several awards. Most recently his *The Maps of Spotsylvania Through Cold Harbor* won the 2023 Army Historical Foundation Distinguished Writing Award in the "Reference" category. He is married, has four children, and six grandchildren.

Brad's presentation will detail two Confederate invasions of the North by Lee's Army of Northern Virginia. First, in 1862 during the Maryland Campaign that culminated in the Battle of Antietam and again during the Pennsylvania Campaign in 1863 that ended with the retreat from Gettysburg. This fast-moving presentation will compare and contrast the two invasions, including why Lee invaded, the size and condition of the two armies, their organizations, logistical issues, the routes to the battlefields, the battles, a comparison of the casualties, and the aftermath. Gottfried will deploy a

PowerPoint presentation to illustrate his points. He will have books available for purchase as well, including his Map books (*Spotsylvania*, *Gettysburg*, *Antietam*, *Cavalry in the Gettysburg Campaign*, *First Bull Run*, *Wilderness*), *Lee Invades the North*, *Race to the Potomac*, *Lincoln Comes to Gettysburg*, and *Hell Comes to Southern Maryland: Point Lookout*.

In Case You Missed It...

At the October 17 meeting, members heard renowned artist and sculptor Gary Casteel talk about his life events that guided his career before and after tours in Vietnam. Many know of Gary's sculpture of General Longstreet at Gettysburg, but he has numerous others at historic sites and battlefields across the country, as well as a monument to Confederate unknown dead from Monocacy at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Frederick. He hopes that his design for a National Civil War Monument will be built locally soon. Gary's studio is at 789 Baltimore Street in Gettysburg (CASTEELSCULPTURES.COM, VALLEYARTSPUBLISHING.COM) where he has monument replicas, canvases, plaques, and prints for sale, and continues to work on other monuments.

November Book Review

Embattled Capital: A Guide to Richmond During the Civil War, by

Robert M. Dunkerly and Doug Crenshaw, Savas Beatie, Emerging Civil War Series. 177 pgs., pictures, maps, \$14.95 (paperback), ISBN 978-1-61121-491-8. Reviewed by: Matthew A. Borders

I was fortunate to receive *Embattled Capital: A Guide to Richmond During the Civil War* this past spring. The authors are amongst the stable of up and coming public and academic historians utilized by the ever-popular Emerging Civil War series. In this case the book is an actual guidebook, the sort you take with you when traveling to give you additional information about sites and give you ideas of where else visit.

Embattled Capital begins with a timeline explanation of the fighting that occurred around the Confederate capital from 1862 – 1865. From the Peninsula Campaign in the spring of 1862, to the Fall of Richmond on April 3, 1865, this city saw significant military action and social upheaval. How the city was defended, and how its citizens survived these turbulent years is discussed in the opening chapter.

The following chapters dive into these ideas. Each of the battles that occurred around Richmond are given a blurb history about what happened there, what campaign it was, the result of the battle and sometimes even the estimated casualties. The condition of these battlefield landscapes is also mentioned, as well as all what facilities, if available, are present at the site. It is not just the fighting that is covered, however. Embattled Capital also dives into the Richmond slave trade and the pertinent locations related to enslavement around the city. This is followed up by Reconstruction related locations around the city, as well as memorialization of the war. An analysis and the locations of the various monuments, cemeteries, hospitals, prisons and what other historic landmarks are in and around Richmond are also touched on in this work. Finally, the variety of museums and historic sites around the former Confederate capital are detailed.

For those looking to tour the battlefields and sites in and around Richmond, I highly recommend Embattled Capital. While the book does follow the typical structure of an Emerging Civil War book and does not include citations. The authors wisely chose to include a chapter all about the research centers and libraries in Richmond, as well as a bibliography of the works they used to develop this work.
